**P R O C E E D I N G S**

THE COURT: We're here in the matter of  
Brandon King vs. Genevieve Lucas. This is DR-05-  
4266. Mr. King is present. Mr. Harrelson  
represents Mr. King. Mr. Leibovich is here on  
behalf of the Defendant.

I -- I don't know if everyone is aware, I  
believe maybe you are, there has been tendered to  
the office of the Pulaski County Circuit Clerk the  
sum of \$5,000 on Mr. King's behalf by -- I am  
advised by my bailiff, by an employer or the  
company for whom Mr. King has done work, a law firm  
up in New Jersey and their name escapes me, at the  
moment.

BAILIFF CLIFTON: Patrick Silva.

THE COURT: Spina.

BAILIFF CLIFTON: Spina. I guess, Spina,  
Your Honor.

THE COURT: All right. And based upon the  
tendering of that \$5,000, I will allow Mr. King to  
be released at this time. And then I'll order that  
child support continue as previously ordered by the  
Court.

Any questions or comments on that? And then  
by previously ordered, that is the judgment amount

as well as -- I mean, I'm sorry, the Court ordered amount, plus the amount ordered for past due child support.

Mr. Leibovich?

MR. LEIBOVICH: Yes, Your Honor. I have two requests. One, is there was no objection at the previous hearing that Mr. King make arrangements to contact Dr. Pelz, who is the counselor --

THE COURT: Correct.

MR. LEIBOVICH: -- for the minor child.

THE COURT: Correct.

MR. LEIBOVICH: I'm tendering that name and number to his attorney just to make sure he has that information. I'm also going to request that this Court give us leave to request a body attachment if there comes a point in time where Mr. King becomes substantially delinquent, and that a -- upon an affidavit, a body attachment will issue.

THE COURT: All right. Let me ask, what is the -- the frequency with -- is it weekly or is it monthly that support is set?

MR. LEIBOVICH: It's currently set at weekly, Your Honor.

THE COURT: All right. If -- I will order that if Mr. King misses any three -- well, four

1 child support payments within a three-month period,  
2 that there will be a pick-up order issued.

3 And I've done an order that will authorize Mr.  
4 King's release today. Now, when the sheriff gets  
5 to that, I don't know, but they'll -- they should  
6 release him sometime today. All right. Anything  
7 else?

8 MR. LEIBOVICH: No, Your Honor.

9 THE COURT: Mr. Leibovich, if you'll do me a  
10 separate order that reflects that Mr. King is being  
11 released today upon the payment of 5,000; and that  
12 the clerk is hereby ordered and directed to release  
13 those sums to you to payment to Ms. Lucas; that Mr.  
14 King will commence his child support -- current  
15 child support payment, plus 20 percent toward an  
16 arrearage payment; then -- and if he misses any four  
17 payments within the next 90 days -- in any 90-day  
18 period, that a pick-up order may issue.

19 Well, let me -- if I say that in 90 days he  
20 misses three, and 90 days he misses three, and 90  
21 days, and three in 90 days -- I'll just order that  
22 any four child support payments are missed and --  
23 you know, if -- if Mr. -- if Mr. King becomes  
24 delinquent one month's or four weeks' worth of  
25 child support at any time, then a pick-up order may

issue.

Mr. King, you're going to have to pay your child support, and you're going to have to pay it regularly. If you miss four payments -- so if you miss one this month, one next month, one three months from now, and one, you know, six months from now, they're going to issue a pick-up order to me and I'm going to sign it. And chances are, you're going to be taken back into custody, so.

Anything else?

MR. LEIBOVICH: No, Your Honor.

MR. HARRELSON: No, Your Honor.
